Jotsana holds multiple qualifications including diplomas in Hospitality, Education, and Business Administration, a Master's in Education, and is currently a PhD candidate at Federation University. Associate Professor Tom O'connor

Dr. Tom O'Connor has an extensive academic background, including a Bachelor of Arts, a Diploma of Education, multiple graduate diplomas, three master's degrees, and a Doctorate in Postmodern Theory. He began his career teaching English, Drama, and Media Studies in secondary schools across Australia, the UK, Ireland, and the US. In Australia, he served as English Coordinator at CRC St Albans and held leadership positions at CRC Sydenham and Caroline Chisholm Catholic College, where he played a key role in the school's amalgamation and development of the first VCE English curriculum.

Transitioning to higher education, Dr. O'Connor lectured at Griffith University and Central Queensland University, developed business curricula for the Saudi VET sector, and served as Head of Business at Ras Al Khaimah Women's College in the UAE. He also led the Victoria International School Sharjah project, bringing Australian pedagogy to the UAE.

Returning to Australia, he became Curriculum Director and Acting Principal at Thomas Carr College, initiating partnerships to deliver the VCE in China. At Firbank Grammar School, he expanded offshore VCE programs to ten schools, making it the largest provider of VCE offshore.

Dr. O'Connor has a passion for musical theatre, writing and directing productions performed internationally, including in Melbourne, California, the Middle East, and Northern Ireland. He is currently a Fellow of the UBSS Centre for Scholarship and Research, a consulting Principal at Shanghai Normal University Tianhua High School, and holds roles as Associate Director of Postgraduate Studies and Director of Special Projects at UBSS Melbourne.



Professor Jim Mienczakowski *Dip CSSD. Royal Central School of Speech & Drama (Uni Lond), Cert. Ed. (Lond), B.Ed (Uni Lond), MA (King's College Lond), PhD (Griff)*

Jim has lived and taught in a number of countries during a career in education which spans more than 40 years. Earlier working in commercial theatre and radio in London he eventually moved fulltime into education in 1979.

Jim is internationally recognised for his contribution to, and work in, founding an academic research methodology combining performance and research (critical ethnodrama) which is intended for use by graduate arts students and arts and health practitioners seeking to voice the concerns of marginalised communities. He has published extensively in this area.

From 2013 Professor Mienczakowski was CEO, President and Pro Vice Chancellor of Curtin Malaysia until he and his family returned to Australia in early 2020. Prior to joining Curtin, Jim lived in the UAE for several years where he was Executive Director of Higher Education in Abu Dhabi and then later Vice-Chancellor of the Abu Dhabi Education Council's Emirate's College.

Earlier in his career he also held senior leadership positions in a number of higher education institutions in Australia, including Deputy Vice-Chancellor roles at Victoria University and Central Queensland University.

Much of Jim's work in the last decade or two has entailed successfully taking institutions through accreditation processes and improving the quality of learning, research and service offered to students. Currently a Higher Education Consultant, Jim continues to serve on the Editorial Board of Sage's Qualitative Research and as a reviewer for a number of other journals. In 2019 he was made an Emeritus Professor of Curtin University for his contributions and services to higher education and the university.
