Madilina Tresca *CMgr AFIML, MA, GradCert CSM*

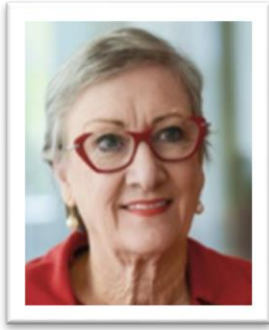

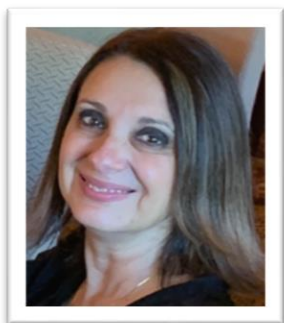
